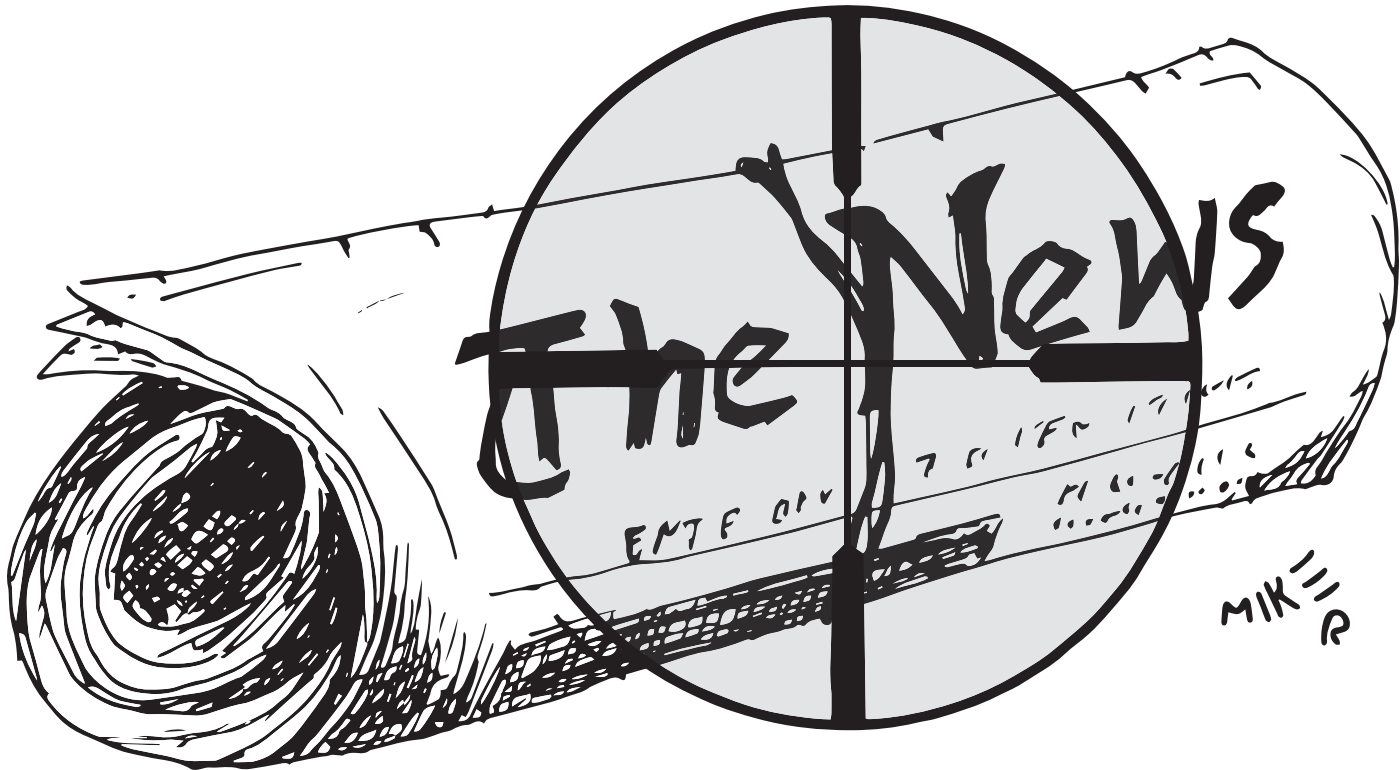


Your local newspaper is under attack.
