

SNPA News Industry Summit

The Nashville Hilton | Oct. 10-12, 2018

We look forward to seeing you at the SNPA News Industry Summit in Nashville, Oct. 10-12.

The program tackles critical issues, and more than 140 attendees are registered to attend from daily newspapers, community newspapers, and companies that provide goods and services to the newspaper industry.

The meeting will be held at the <u>Nashville Hilton</u> in downtown Nashville, Tennessee. The hotel's address is 121 Fourth Avenue South. The main telephone number is 615-620-1000.

GETTING THERE

The hotel is 25 minutes from the Nashville airport. A taxi from the airport costs about \$25. Uber and Lyft are also available. Rental cars are available at the airport, starting at \$55 per day.

Overnight valet parking at the Hilton is available to SNPA guests for \$34 per night. (*This is a contracted rate, so check your bill to make sure you get the discount.*) Self-parking is \$30.
